William Hurrell prosperous farmer (mother was a Greenhill)

had John Greenhills Harston lands 1718 got lease of Newton Bury/Manor Farm . Purchased the freehold in 1859 for the sum of £5360. Churchwarden from 1701-15, Overseer of Poor 1729-31.
